4. FIRST AID MEASURES

EYES: Protect unharmed eye. Remove contact lenses, if worn. Rinse opened eye for several minutes under running water, then consult a doctor.

SKIN: Immediately rinse with water. If skin irritation continues, consult a physician.

INGESTION: Rinse out mouth and then drink plenty of water. Do not induce vomiting; immediately call for medical help.

INHALATION: Supply fresh air; consult a doctor in case of complaints.

SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS OF OVEREXPOSURE

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

GENERAL PROCEDURES: Use limestone to neutralize and absorb spill. Ensure adequate ventilation. Dispose contaminated material as waste in accordance with Section 13. Send for recovery or disposal in suitable receptacles.

RELEASE NOTES: Do not allow to enter sewers/surface or ground water. Inform respective authorities in case of seepage into water course or sewage system.

SPECIAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT: Use respiratory protective device against the effects of fumes/dust/aerosol. Wear protective equipment. Keep unprotected persons away. Ensure adequate ventilation.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

HANDLING: Prevent formation of aerosols. Avoid splashes or spray in enclosed areas. Use only in well ventilated areas.

STORAGE: Use only receptacles specifically permitted for this product. Aluminum is an unsuitable material to use as receptacle.

Store away from foodstuffs. Store away from oxidizing agents. Do not store together with alkalies (caustic solutions). Store away from metals.

Store in cool, dry conditions in well sealed receptacles. Keep containers tightly sealed.

10. STABILITY AND REACTIVITY

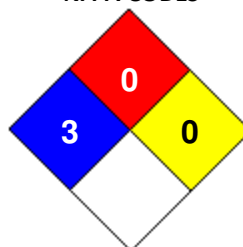
